1618 West Seafood Grill - 1618 W Friendly Ave., Greensboro, 336.235.0898

Great wine list and food is very good too. The best fried oysters in town, and one of the best cocktail lounges. ("Great bar with a cute bartender," chimes in one of our staff!) Delicious seafood fare in an upscale atmosphere

Bert's Seafood 4608 West Market 854-2314

One of our favorites. The owner is also very involved in community philanthropy and was co-founder of the Thanksgiving Fund at the Community Foundation.

Boba House – 332 Tate St., Greensboro, 336.379.7444

Vegetarian fare that is wonderfully good. It's an adventure!

Bistro Sofia - 616 Dolly Madison Rd., Greensboro, 336.855.1313

Upscale dining in a quaint, beautiful atmosphere. Locally sourced food prepared creatively and deliciously. A staff member says "I have found service and food to be quite good."

Fishbones – 2119 Walker Avenue, Sunset Hills, Greensboro, 336-370-4900

Electric local watering hole with amazing food. The Twisted Chicken burrito and Sweet Chili wings are a must...and do try to blackened green beans!

Fishers Grille – 608 North Elm Street, edge of Downtown Greensboro, 336-375-8300

The epitome of local neighborhood color. Best burger in town, and it's under \$5. Outside dining for smoke-free environment.

Green Valley Grill – 622 Green Valley Rd., Greensboro, 336.854.2015

Owned by the Proximity's owners adjacent to their O. Henry Hotel (yes – named for Greensboro native O. Henry!) A staff member says "one my most favorite places!" Excellent service! Eat outside if you can – their patio is gorgeous! The best thing on the menu, according to several staffers?: Parmesan crusted chicken with goat cheese.

Hogan's Groovy Gourmet – 600 S Elam Ave, Greensboro, 336.274.0499

Slow foods to go featuring vegetarian and all kinds of delicious and new ways to put food together!

Le Blon – 4512 W Market St., Greensboro, 336.294.2605

Brazilian cuisine served by a cadre of gauchos who carve an array of delicious meats tableside. The salad bar is incredible!

Libby Hill Seafood – multiple locations including 3920 Cotswold Ave., Greensboro, 336.288.6782

This family-owned seafood restaurant is a Greensboro institution. The family offers scholarships and other philanthropic support through their funds at the Community Foundation. Also, if you are craving chicken, they have incredible fried chicken tenders!

Liberty Oak Restaurant – 100-D West Washington Street, Downtown Greensboro, 336.273.7057 a popular spot for years, their move to downtown helped build the center city renaissance of the late 1990's. The sweet potato soup is awesome and the chicken salad changes daily! We also highly recommend their Oriental Beef Salad.

Lucky 32 – 1421 Westover Terrace, Just off Wendover Ave., 336.370.0707

A Greensboro tradition. The menu changes often featuring local foods and delectable renditions of southern favorites.

Mellow Mushroom – 609 South Elm St., Downtown Greensboro, 336.235.2840

Gourmet Pizzas and sandwiches - awesome Caesar Salad-topped Pizza! We love it.

Natty Greene's – 345 South Elm St., Downtown Greensboro, 336.274.1373

Greensboro's namesake General Nathaniel Greene inspired this popular spot. They brew their own beers and offer delicious pub fare. Some of the owners are very involved in community philanthropy!

Pho Hien Vong – 4109-a Spring Garden St., Greensboro, 336.294.5551

Vietnamese noodles are a favorite here and Thai favorites are featured as well. Friendly staff will customize your order or explain options for those new to the delights of this cuisine. One staff member says, "it is noodle heaven".

Printworks Bistro – Proximity Hotel – 336.379.0699

Another Quaintance/Weaver restaurant. An American uptake on light Provencal fare. Any version of the trout is "to die for," the flatbreads are "mouth-watering," and the burger rivals Fishers for best in town. Brunch is also wonderful – don't miss the beignets!
